The Liturgical Season of Lent this year begins with Ash Wednesday next Wednesday 22nd February. Lent marks for us as Christians a time to prepare for Easter. On Ash Wednesday we are marked with the cross to remind us that we are embarking on the 40 days of prayer, repentance and alms giving. This ends on Holy Thursday when the Season of Easter begins. This Lenten period allows us a time for self-discipline as we prepare for Easter, which is considered the holiest day of the year commemorating Jesus' resurrection. Lent for us also replicates Jesus' sacrifice in the desert and his avoidance of temptation during those 40 days. Therefore, in this period we try to abstain from luxuries and commit to fasting and prayer as a way to focus ourselves on the true importance of this time. As a whole school, we will be attending the Parish Mass at 9.15 am.
