

FROM THE PRINCIPAL

This Sunday we celebrate the Feast of Christ the King, also called the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe. The Feast was established by Pope Pius XI in 1925, to respond to a world that was rejecting Christ and was being dominated by secularism. This feast emphasises the true kingship of Christ. It is one of the most important titles of Jesus. Even though Jesus Christ was not a king in the earthly sense, He is the divine King of the Universe, who unites all of creation with the Father. This feast marks the end of the Liturgical year. The new Liturgical year begins with the first Sunday of Advent which falls on the 3rd of December.

Christmas Carols



Preparations are well and truly underway for our Christmas Carols to be held on the school oval on Wednesday 29th November. As this is the final event for the year we are hoping that all our families will join us to celebrate the end of another wonderful year of learning. Families are invited to bring picnic rugs, picnic chairs and join in with the singing as the students present a simple Nativity story. Whole School Orientation for 2024

The students from Prep to Year 5 will meet their new classes and teacher for next on year on December 8th for lunch at 11.30am and then again for an hour's activity session on Monday 11th December at 10.30am.

Class Groupings for 2024

We have finalised the class groupings for next year. This task is a very difficult one for staff as they need to take into consideration many factors when looking at placing students in classes for the following year. Creating classes is very time consuming as much thought is put into ensuring students have at least ONE friend – not necessarily their best friend – who is a positive influence within the classroom and supports their classmate's learning. Other friendships can be cultivated and are encouraged when the students are interacting outside of the classroom learning environment. We also take into account the students' developmental needs while trying to keep a balance of both gender and additional needs within the classroom. It has taken a considerable amount of time and energy to put the classes together and we are not able to change any students now as it will affect the dynamics within the group. Please know that the students and their needs have been at the centre of all decisions and therefore no further changes are possible to class groupings. I know that all our families will support us in this matter.

School Closure Day

Please note that Thursday December 7th is a pupil free day to allow staff to plan for the 2024 school year. Students are not required at school on this day.

The 2023 School Year Ends on Thursday 14th December after graduation for the Year 6 students and on Friday 15th for all students from Prep – Year 5.

Timetable Changes for 2024

After having trialed a new time structure this year, we have decided that having such a long morning session is not beneficial for the children as it is far too long before they get a break. Therefore in 2024 we will have this structure in place which also allows for lunch to be a little later in the day. Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe - Sunday 26th November

The Church celebrates the Feast of Christ the King, also called the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe, on the last Sunday of the Liturgical Year.

This Sunday is the last Sunday in Ordinary Time and is dedicated to the very highest understanding of the nature, role, and purpose of Jesus of Nazareth. Jesus is multifaceted, the deep hues and contours of his personality revealing themselves to everyone in different ways.

The Feast was established by Pope Pius XI in 1925 with his encyclical *Quas primas*, in order to respond to a world that was rejecting Christ and was being dominated by secularism.

Pope Pius hoped that the establishment of this feast would assist us to gain strength in our true King, Jesus Christ. His encyclical calls all nations to see that the Church has the right to freedom, and immunity from the state. In modern time, we are challenged in our faith and our ability to worship together. May we always remember that Jesus Christ is Our King who reigns forever.

Pope Pius also hoped that leaders and nations might come to recognise and give respect to Christ the King and that individuals honour Jesus as their 'Sovereign King.'

May we emulate Jesus' total gift of self, perfectly embodied on the Cross. In imitation of our thorn-crowned King, individuals can help bring love and relief to those who suffer. May we continue to proclaim the Good News of the Reign of Christ in the world today.
