# COMPASS

Our new comprehensive communication APP, Compass, is up and running and we are finally becoming more accustomed to using it. Could all families please ensure you have downloaded this APP onto your phones or other devices so that all communication is received. We have also included the First Aid notifications on the APP. Please note that should your child now attend First Aid, you will receive a notification via Compass to advise you of the reason. If you feel that your child needs your attention due to their injury, please feel free to contact the school. We do not contact parents for every visit a child makes to First Aid, we make contact for head/facial injuries or other serious injuries that we can see or know of. Unfortunately staff, whilst First Aid trained, are not doctors. We do not diagnose illnesses or injuries, we can only be guided by the students when they present at First Aid. We do our best and take our Duty of Care seriously, we look after the students whilst in first aid, but if the student says he/she is OK and can return to class, then we believe them. We are mindful that many families work and we try to minimize interrupting them whilst at work. However, if you wish to come and collect your child from First Aid then please feel free to do so, but please advise us that you are doing so.

#### Enrolment for Foundation Year (Prep) 2025

The enrolment period is now open and we are accepting enrolments for 2025. If any of our families have children starting school in 2025, could you please enroll as soon as possible. This will help us with offering places to new families. We have already had enrolment forms lodged for next year, which is very pleasing.

# **School Advisory Council**

The first meeting of the SAC was held on Tuesday evening. We thank Mr John Ciccaldo, Mrs Tina Grandikis, Mr Ashutosh Porwal, Mrs Pamela Siluzzo and Mr Brian Walter who have agreed to continue on the Council. The first meeting always seems to take longer as we discuss our hopes and aspirations for the academic year ahead. Mrs Dianne Viola presented, on behalf of our Math and Literacy Leaders, the new learning directions for our English and Math Curriculum. These are based on the MACS 2030 strategic plan. In particular, we briefly looked at the Vision For Instruction Flourishing Learners position statement which governs our curriculum in Catholic Schools. It was a great opportunity to provide some clarity on why we have changed our pedagogy and to better understand what is different and how it is being implemented. We are all on this learning journey together with the purpose of improving student learning and outcomes.

# St Damians Parents Association (P.A.)

#### Lent

Lent is a time of reflection and renewal. It is a time for Christians to consider how they live the Word of God and to renew this living. The Lenten practices of Prayer, Fasting and Almsgiving help us, as Christians, to embody the values of justice, compassion and generosity.

#### Lenten Reflection

We all know times when it seems that darkness has swallowed us up, when we feel weighed down by sorrow and despair. The notion of "hope", seems hollow and a long way off. *How then, do we step into the Light? Can we even see that Light exists somewhere, anywhere?* The darkness is a reflection of our attempts at self-sufficiency, and our lack of trust in the mystery of God, always present and always bringing life out of darkness. Perhaps the first stage of stepping into the Light, is simply to accept the darkness, and to allow God to transform us into Light.

#### **Social Justice - Project Compassion**

Throughout the Lenten Season, our School Community is reminded to pay attention to the care of others. We are invited to support a Caritas initiative, Project Compassion, to help others and ensure that we consider their wellbeing. # Solemnity of Saint Patrick (c. 415 – c. 493) – Sunday 17<sup>th</sup> March

On Sunday, we celebrate the Solemnity of Saint Patrick. Saint Patrick's humility and courage guided his life and he became instrumental in winning most of Ireland for Christ. Prior to the fifth century, Ireland's background was predominantly pagan. After being consecrated as a bishop at the age of forty-three, Saint Patrick continued in his lifelong desire to proclaim the Good News. He ordained many priests, divided Ireland into dioceses, held Church councils, founded several monasteries and continually urged his people to greater holiness in Christ. What distinguishes Saint Patrick is the durability of his efforts. When we consider the state of Ireland when he began his mission work, the vast extent of his labours (most of Ireland) and how the seeds he planted continued to grow and flourish, we can only admire the kind of man Saint Patrick must have been. The holiness of a person is known only by the fruits of his or her work.
