Dear Parents/Guardians & Carers

A warm welcome back to all our families, students and staff. I trust everyone had a restful holiday and a happy Easter. Term 2 has started well and everyone has settled into their learning routines. This term we look forward to completing our enrolment process with interviews; Reconciliation Week, Sorry Day and the Long Walk. The P & A have organized a Wine Tour for the community which promises to be a fun day. There is more information on this further down in the newsletter. The Year 2 students are beginning their preparations to receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation to be celebrated in June. The Year 6's also begin their formal preparations for the Sacrament of Confirmation celebrated in July. We also look forward to Family Day which will be celebrated in July. Of course, amongst all this there is the normal daily learning and teaching. We are looking forward to another very busy term.

ANZAC DAY

ANZAC Day is the national day of commemoration of Australia and New Zealand for victims of war and for recognition of the role of their armed forces. It marks the first major military action fought by Australian and New Zealand forces during the First World War. Next Thursday, some of our student leaders will take part in the wreath laying ceremony at the Watsonia RSL. Our school is one of the many schools in the area that will lay a wreath in honor of all those who served in this campaign.

Before School Supervision

It is becoming increasingly alarming to see many students being dropped off at school before supervision begins. Parents, this is **not a safe practice**! Staff do not begin their work day, therefore supervision of students, until 8.30am, so your children are not being cared for by anyone until then. Staff on premises cannot see or hear the children, so if something goes wrong no one would be aware. The office does not open until 8.30am and the school is locked. NO students are to be left at school prior to 8.30am. I am well aware that many parents work and that is why we have contracted with the Out of Hours Care Service – Their Care – who operate from 7.00am to cater for students who need to come to school early. Parents must use this service or else remain with their children until staff duty begins. This is to ensure that your children are safe at all times. Please work with us to keep your children safe!!

Kiss and Drop

The Kiss and Drop area off Joseph Street is closed to cars after school. At times parents may see the gates open, however this is **not an invitation to enter**. Cars are not permitted to enter the school from this entry point in the afternoon as students and families exit the school and it is very dangerous. Also, please be aware that only one side of Joseph Street is available for parking. The other side is a No Standing Zone. Park your car in surrounding side streets and walk to the school grounds. Walking is very good exercise for both adults and children alike. Also do not use the driveway closest to the school gate to conduct a three point turn. Again, this is very dangerous as children and families exit the school via the gate. Only families picking up from After School Care may enter the school **after 3.30pm**. Thank you for your co-operation.

School Assembly

Our next school assembly is next Monday 22nd May at 2.40pm in the hall. The Year 5R class will present at this assembly. All families welcome.

Uniforms Term 2

As term two begins in April, the weather may be variable with some warmer days experienced as well as some cooler days. For the remainder of April, the students may wear either summer or winter uniform to suit the weather. Please do not mix summer and winter uniform. It is one or the other. From 6th May, which is week four of term two, all students will be expected in full winter uniform.

School Closure Days

Thursday 25th April is ANZAC Day a public holiday. On **Friday 26th April** school is closed for a Time In Lieu day for staff to compensate for extra hours worked over the second term.

Monday 6th May is a School Closure Day. Staff will be engaged on working with Ingrid Green on developing their R.E. Programs. Students are not required at school on this day.

Whooping Cough Notification—Important Information

What is the issue?

The South East Public Health Unit (SEPHU) has been notified of whooping cough (pertussis) outbreaks in several schools in its catchment. Notification data indicates that there has been an increase in cases notified to the Department of Health, with the majority of cases within the 10-to-14-year age group.

What is whooping cough (pertussis)?

Whooping cough is a very contagious respiratory infection caused by the bacterium *Bordetella Pertussis*. The major symptom of whooping cough is the characteristic cough which is often followed by a 'whooping' sound (which is not always obvious) when breathing in. Cold like symptoms often precede the cough, and vomiting after coughing is common. The bacterium is spread by airborne droplets from the upper respiratory tract (when the infected person coughs or sneezes). A person is infectious for the first 21 days of their cough or until they have completed an appropriate course of antibiotics. However, the cough may persist for up to 3 months, despite antibiotic treatment.

Who is most at risk?

Babies under 12 months of age are most at risk and the infection can potentially be life-threatening for infants aged 6 months and under. Household contacts and carers such as parents and siblings are often the source of infection in infants. **Is whooping cough preventable?**

Whooping cough is a vaccine-preventable disease and the vaccine is provided at no cost under the National Immunisation Program (NIP). Under the NIP, vaccination is recommended for children at 2,4,6, and 18 months and 4 years of age. Adolescents in Year 7 (or age equivalent) are also eligible for a booster.

Adults who have not had a dose in the last 10 years are recommended to have boosters. Routine boosters are recommended for certain adult cohorts and includes women who are pregnant or breastfeeding, healthcare workers, earlier childhood educators and carer and people in close contact with infants.

Pertussis-containing vaccines protect against severe and typical pertussis. Immunity after receiving a pertussis-containing vaccine does wane over time. It is important for individuals to keep up to date with their vaccinations, including boosters.

What should schools do if there are reported cases of whooping cough among students and staff?

As per the Public Health and Wellbeing Regulations 2019, Schedule 7, the minimum period of exclusion from primary schools and children's services for children diagnosed with whooping cough is 21 days after the onset of cough or until they have completed 5 days of a course of antibiotic treatment. Contacts aged less than 7 years in the same classroom as the case who have not received three doses of pertussis vaccine should be excluded for 14 days after the last exposure to the infectious case, or until they have taken 5 days of a course of effective antibiotic treatment

Communication to the wider school community is beneficial for alerting them of cases and to present to their local health service for appropriate testing and treatment if they develop symptoms.

Schools may continue to notify SEPHU of cases and outbreaks at sephu.trace@monashhealth.org, or if assistance is required with managing the outbreak.
