St Damian's Catholic Primary School School Advisory Council Principal's Report November 13th 2024

Dear Members of the School Advisory Council and the St Damian School Community,

It is with pleasure that I present this final report for the 2024 school year. This report provides a summary of the year's activities, achievements and future plans as a school community.

Our School Community's highlights for 2024 were focused on some key areas. By the end of November, in **Education in Faith** we will have celebrated all three Sacraments this year, including Reconciliation with the Year 2 students, Confirmation with the Year 6 students and First Eucharist with the Year 4 students. Our parents and families were invited to participate in the Sacramental workshops run by the Presentation Sisters. These sessions unpack the Sacraments for both the children and their families and gives them an opportunity to further their understanding. Our hopes and dreams for the students is that this journey of faith which they are travelling will help to sustain them when they come to the crossroads of life. As the children experience different circumstances throughout their lives we hope they will always feel connected to their faith, their faith community and come to know and love a merciful and loving God who will guide them throughout their lives. We also thank Fr Dong for his continued support of our school and for his ministry and guidance which allows us to feel connected to the Parish community.

In the **Learning and Teaching** space we have much to celebrate. Once again the NAPLAN results for Year 3 and Year 5, show that the majority of our students are achieving above the State and National benchmarks, with many of our students excelling in English and Mathematics. We have continued the Literacy Enhancement Program which mirrors the programs implemented in the classrooms. This program allows for more students to be identified and supported with their English skills acquisition by targetting students in the early years of learning, namely Year 1 and 2. As a Leadership team, we have continued to build our understanding of the Vision for Instruction that MACS is implementing.

Many of our students have experienced a variety of extra-curricular achievements, some in Mathematics through various competitions, others in P.E. activities such as athletics or sport. As usual, the students were offered a comprehensive curriculum with many opportunities for incursions/excursions to experience hands on learning.

In Leadership this year we celebrated the completion of our building project. We marked this event with a formal blessing by Archbishop Comensoli and official opening by Mr Colin Brooks, State Member for Bundoora and the Executive Director of Catholic Schools, Dr Edward Simons on Friday 20th September. The event went off smoothly and to plan. We were fortunate to have some parishioners also attend as well as some of our current families, members of the Eastern Region Catholic Education Office, including the Regional Manager Mrs Marwin Austerberry and members of the SAC and P.A. We offered tours to showcase the new facility and we concluded the celebration with morning tea. Overall, everyone admired our new facilities and congratulated us on the improvements made to the school. Our School Leadership has worked tirelessly this year to support our teachers with the Vision for Instruction initiative introduced by MACS. The Leadership Team attended a number of Professional Learning sessions provided by the Eastern Regional Office to better understand how to implement this successfully in schools. We welcomed Mrs Julie Cannatelli this year to our Leadership Team as one of our Literacy Leaders. Both Literacy Leaders have worked very hard alongside our Coach provided by Latrobe University. This has supported our teachers to implement the new Literacy program across the school, with Little Learners Love Literacy in Prep to Year 2 and Ochre Reading in Years 3-6. We have already seen improvements in the students' learning. Carmen Bruce, our Math Leader has worked tirelessly with our teachers to implement the new Ochre Math program. Our teachers have worked very hard this year to implement many changes to their pedagogical practices. We congratulate them and our school leaders for their work and commitment to ensuring that great learning continues at St Damian's.

One of the most critical areas in schools is **Student Wellbeing/Pastoral Care.** We continued with the roles of Student Wellbeing Leader and Learning Diversity Leader who have worked to support students and families across the school with various needs. We also expanded the number of Learning Support Officers to ensure that students with additional needs received the support required to help them manage their learning. The school Psychologist worked one day per week. Her role was mainly to give assistance to students experiencing mental health issues and also social and emotional issues. The School Psychologist had a full case load for the year squeezing in as many students as possible. We had funding for one year from the Health in Schools program, unfortunately this does not continue into 2025.

For next year, we will utilize some of the NCCD funding to provide this service as many of the students the Psychologist saw where recipients of NCCD. The Respectful Relationships initiative continues in the school with the Student Wellbeing Leader driving this work with the teachers. Students undertake units of work focused on developing positive and respectful relationships with one another. One of the areas of concern for us this year has been around the use of social media. We invited the Police into the school to speak to our senior students about the safe and responsible use of social media. The police also spoke to them about the appropriateness of them accessing this medium and the dangers that can lurk there. This year we expanded our external Camp Program and for the first time, the Year 3 students joined the Year 4 students for a 2 day one night adventure camp experience. The students thoroughly enjoyed this opportunity. Child Safety continues to be an area of priority with all staff cognizant of their responsibilities in keeping children safe at all times. Finally, the Prep Orientations will concluded in mid-November thereby allowing for a smooth and positive transition into Primary School for all the incoming Preps.

We value **Community engagement** and encourage a variety of ways for parent involvement. We implemented the new communication platform Compass to better manage and streamline all communication. This has been very successful and well received by the community. This year we celebrated the children's learning with the Arts Show /Math night. It was an amazing community event will all families attending throughout the evening. The P.A. also had a sausage sizzle with many parents and teachers cooking on the night. We received much positive feedback and everyone could find something to enjoy, whether it was face painting, musical recitals, the choir singing, enjoying the children's art work or having fun playing maths games. There was certainly something for everyone. It was a very successful event. The five parents who are part of the School Advisory Council have continued to support the school by providing guidance and support throughout the year. The tireless work done by the P.A. Committee has ensured that the new Literacy program was adequately resourced. Much of the funds raised over the past twelve months have been expended on the purchase of Literacy resources to complement our new SOR program to ensure that this curriculum area could be taught well. Our Volunteer program supported many classes with parents volunteering to attend Camp experiences, excursions, classroom helper programs, supporting the various school events held during the year as well as sporting events and activities. Without the generous support of our community, many of the things we currently do would not be possible. We are most grateful to our families for their support and generosity.

Speaking of generosity, our wonderful students, with the support of their teachers and peers have held some fundraising events this year. The Year 4 students organized a fund raiser to aid cancer research. They made loom bands and sold these to the students in the school. They raised over \$500. The Year 6 students will hold their market stalls later in November. This initiave is part of their Math program where they study economics and business. All money raised from this initiative will be donated to various charities as chosen by the students. We congratulate the students on their initiative and also their care and concern for others. Over the year the school community has supported St Vincent de Paul society through the winter appeal and Christmas giving tree; Caritas through the term one bring a gold coin casual dress day and Project Compassion. These very worthy charities work tirelessly to help those in need in our community. We are very proud of the efforts of this community who strive to be the Hands, Heart and Voice of Christ in so many ways.

In looking ahead to **Future Directions,** our school community is committed to expanding academic programs to meet the evolving needs of our students. In 2025 we will be strengthening the delivery of the reading program to embed it in our pedagogical practices with the aim of continually improving student outcomes and teacher knowledge.

We aim to continue to provide our students with quality facilities and resources to enable them to learn in an environment that meets their needs. With this in mind we will strive to continue to renew resources to support the students' learning.

In ending, I look forward to the continued collaboration between the school community and the School Advisory Council to achieve our goals and provide the best possible education for our students. I am most grateful for the support of our school community. We value your support and participation in our school's progress. I would like to take this opportunity to thank each of the members of the SAC, for their advice and contribution made to the school. We look forward to meeting again in 2025 and continuing to work in partnership. My heartfelt thanks are extended to the staff, parents and students for all that has been achieved this year. A special thank you to the P.A Committee for all their hard work and the support given to ensure we can provide appropriate resources to support student learning. I wish all of our parent community a very joyous Christmas Season. May the blessings of this special time of the year be with you all.
