#### All Saints Day/All Souls Day

November 1st is All Saints Day. In a practice dating back centuries, the Roman Catholic Church observes these two days as a time in which the living commemorate the dead. November 1st is All Saints Day, a feast day observing the lives of the many saints for whom there is no specific feast day during the year. The following day, November 2nd, marks a day of prayer for, and remembrance of relatives and friends who are no longer living. Masses are usually attended and offered for the repose of their souls. Mass will be celebrated here at St Damian's on Friday evening to commemorate All Saints Day.

Our Students will be participating in a **Sacrament of Eucharist Reflection Day** here at School on **Thursday 7th November.** All Year Four Students are invited to wear casual clothes on this day.

#### Sacrament of Eucharist Parish Presentation Masses

Sacrament of Eucharist Parish Presentation Masses will take place on Saturday 9th November at 5:30pm and Sunday 10th November at 10am. Please choose whichever date suits your family best. You do not need to tell the School which Mass you will attend.

#### Solemnity of All Saints – Friday 1st November

The Catholic Church established feast days to celebrate our oneness in faith. On All Saints' Day, we celebrate every martyr and holy person recognised by the Church and sanctified by Christ. Importantly, we have all been sanctified by Christ. According to Jesus in His Sermon on the Mount, our sainthood begins when we give our total trust in God; when we strive to be meek and humble; when we hunger for righteousness; when we are merciful to others; when our hearts are pure and holy; when we seek peace and harmony; and when we accept persecution for not only righteousness' sake but for Christ's sake. In this way, we allow God to transform us and lead us toward sainthood. Through our words and deeds, may we be counted among the saints. The evangelist Matthew reminds us to "Rejoice and be glad, for your reward will be great in heaven" (Matthew 5:12).

#### The Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed (All Souls Day) - Saturday 2nd November

This Saturday, we commemorate All Souls' Day. The Church has encouraged Prayer for the dead from the earliest times as an act of Christian charity. "If we had no care for the dead," Augustine noted, "we would not be in the habit of praying for them." Yet pre-Christian rites for the deceased retained such a strong hold on the superstitious imagination that a liturgical commemoration was not observed until the early Middle Ages, when monastic communities began to mark an annual day of Prayer for the departed members.

In the middle of the 11th century, Saint Odilo, abbot of Cluny, France, decreed that all Cluniac monasteries offer special Prayers and sing the Office for the Dead on 2nd November, the day after the Feast of All Saints. The custom spread from Cluny and was finally adopted throughout the Roman Church.

The theological underpinning of the feast is the acknowledgment of human frailty. Since few people achieve perfection in this life but, rather, go to the grave still scarred with traces of sinfulness, some period of purification seems necessary before a soul comes face-to-face with God. The Council of Trent affirmed this purgatory state and insisted that the Prayers of the living can speed the process of purification.

#### **Prayer to the Saints**

Oh, Saints of God who lived, loved, died and rose as did Jesus. Be our companions that we may be large in thought, word and deed. Bringing peace, joy, love and compassion to our lives and all around us. To God be glory in Christ Jesus throughout all generations,

forever and ever. Amen.














The Year 6 students invite St Damian's school community to support their small businesses at the Year 6 Market Day.
